



# Freethorpe Primary P.E. and Sports Premium Funding Plan 2022-23



**Vision: ALL pupils leaving Freethorpe Primary school will be physically literate and equipped with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. They will be able to swim at least 25 metres competently using a range of strokes and can perform safe self rescue in a variety of water based situations.**

**Objective: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools against 5 key DfE indicators:**

- 1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles**
- 2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement**
- 3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport**
- 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils**
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport**

**This academic year the school will receive £17,090 - (£16,000 + £10 per pupil based on 108 pupils) in sports premium funding. We plan to use our funding in the following ways to improve outcomes for children:**
